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The meeting of the State Officers Electoral Board was called to order at 10:38 a.m. with all members present.


The Chairman called the cases and accepted appearances in objections to candidates' nomination petitions for the February 5, 2008, General Primary Election.

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Chairman Porter called the State Officers Electoral Board Meeting to order at 10:45 a.m. Member Rednour was absent and her proxy was held by Member Keith.

Chairman Porter indicated that a number of cases would be decided and to ensure efficiency he proposed calling them in numerical order.

The Chairman called cases 3a. through 3l. and noted that Mr. Mayers, the objector, was not present as yet. He indicated that he would give the objector a few more minutes.

The Chairman called 3.dd. *Colosia v. Summers*, 07SOEBGP514 and noted that Mr. Scott K. Summers was present *pro se*. The General Counsel said that 600 valid signatures were required for the 16<sup>th</sup> Congressional District. Mr. Summers submitted 628 signatures, 137 were objected to and 101 objections were sustained which brings the total signatures below the 600 requirement. Further, that he concurred with the hearing officer's recommendation. He added that the candidate filed a Motion to Recalculate. Mr. Summers presented his argument to the Board and stated that the 600 number should be used only after the 10 year census redistricting. After lengthy discussion, Member Keith moved to sustain the objection; adopt the recommendations of the hearing officer and general counsel; grant the objection; and the name of Scott K. Summers will not be printed on the ballot. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Chairman Porter called *Mayers v. Mesplay*, 07SOEBGP100; *Mayers v. Ball*, 07SOEBGP101; *Mayers v. Biden*, 07SOEBGP102; *Mayers v. Kucinich*, 07SOEBGP103; *Mayers v. Dodd*, 07SOEBGP104; *Mayers v. Edwards*, 07SOEBGP105; *Mayers v. Obama*, 07SOEBGP107; *Mayers v. Richardson III*, 07SOEBGP109; *Mayers v. McKinney*, 07SOEBGP110; *Mayers v. Hawkins*, 07SOEBGP111; and *Mayers v. Clinton*, 07SOEBGP112. He acknowledged appearances for the candidates and stated that the objector is not present. Because the recommendation of the General Counsel was to concur with the Hearing Officer's recommendation all matters were considered at the same time. Mr. Andrew Spiegel, attorney for candidate Kucinich, stated that the recommendation of the hearing officer mistakenly read that the objection be sustained. Member Keith moved to adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer and general counsel and the names of the candidates will be printed on the ballot. In case number 103, he

moved the name of Dennis Kucinich be printed on the ballot and the objection be overruled. Member McGuffage seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The Chairman called *Mayers v. Hill*, 07SOEBP106 and *Kielczynski, Drake v. Hill*, 07SOEBGP113. Ms. Deanna Mool was present for Objector Drake and no one was appeared for the candidate. General Counsel Sandvoss said that the objection filed against Hill for U.S. Senate stated insufficient number of signatures. He added that 555 signatures were submitted, but the statute requires 5,000. The objector filed a Motion for Summary Judgment and he recommended the Motion be granted, Mr. Sandvoss added that it is uncontested that the objection contained less than 5,000 signatures and he concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendations of the hearing officer and general counsel; that the objection be sustained; and the name of Norm Hill will not be certified to the ballot. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next case ready for decision was *Zahm, Davis v. Dilger*, 07SOEBGP513. The General Counsel summarized the objection against Michael J. Dilger, candidate for the 14<sup>th</sup> Congressional District and noted that the objection fails as it makes general allegations. The hearing officer recommended that the objection be overruled and the general counsel concurs. Member Smart moved to strike the objection and certify the candidate to the ballot. Mr. Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The Chairman asked for a motion to adopt the minutes of the November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting as presented. Vice Chairman Schneider so moved and Mr. Keith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by ayes in unison.



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The special meeting of the State Officers Electoral was called to order via videoconference means at 10:36 a.m. with seven members present. Members Keith, Smart and Walters were present in the Springfield office and Chairman Porter, Vice Chairman Schneider and Member McGuffage present in the Chicago office. Member Rednour was connected via teleconference call and Member Brady arrived at the meeting at 10:40 a.m.

The Board discussed consideration of the nomination papers of Jeffery Hurst, candidate for State Senator, 51<sup>st</sup> District. It was agreed that this should be discussed as the State Board of Elections and was moved to the other business portion of the agenda.

Chairman Porter called the first objection to candidates nominating petitions, *Johnson v. Link*, 07SOEBGP515. Present in Chicago were Mike Lavelle on behalf of the objector and Courtney Nottage on behalf of the candidate, and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel stated the minimum number of signatures required was 1,000 and the number submitted was 3,378. The basis of the objection alleges the petition contains an insufficient number of valid signatures and two circulators do not reside at the address listed in the circulator's affidavit, rendering those sheets invalid. The number of signatures objected to was 2,393 of which 1,660 were sustained and 689 overruled after conducting a binder check. The General Counsel indicated he agreed with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the petition contained no fewer than 1,526 valid signatures (after subtracting the 192 additional names on the Mr. Davison's petition sheets) and therefore should be deemed valid and the name Terry Link appear on the ballot for the office of State Senator for the 30<sup>th</sup> Legislative District. Mr. Lavelle stated he did not agree with the recommendation of the hearing officer and that a definite pattern of fraud was established and the other petition sheets circulated by

Mr. Davison should be stricken as well. Mr. Lavelle then stated that those petition sheets circulated by Mr. Knight also be thrown out due to pattern of fraud. Mr. Nottage indicated he agreed with the recommendation of the hearing officer and that all evidence was considered and no allegation of fraud was contained in the petition. He further explained that based on the testimony it was found that Mr. Knight was in fact a resident at the address on the affidavit. The General Counsel indicated only those signatures that were specifically challenged on Mr. Davidson's petition sheets were sustained and that the pattern of fraud should be pled but not during the proceeding. He further explained that the Board should refrain from introducing issues that could have been introduced at the beginning of the procedure. Member McGuffage moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel that the objection be overruled and the candidate Terry Link be certified to the February 5, 2008 ballot. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 5-3 with Vice Chairman Schneider and Members Smart and Walters voting in the negative.

The General Counsel presented *Coady, O'Hare v. Roney*, 07SOEBGP116. The candidate, Shirley Roney, representing herself and Timothy Dugan on behalf of the objectors were present in the Springfield office. The hearing officer in the case, David Herman was also present in Springfield and no one was present in Chicago. The General Counsel stated the minimum number of signatures required was no fewer than 833 and the number of signatures submitted was 997. The number of signatures objected to was 319 of which 182 were sustained and 126 overruled after conducting a binder check. The hearing officer heard evidence and arguments and ruled that the number of valid signatures was 18 below what was required and that the objection be sustained. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer. Mr. Dugan also concurred and asked that the Board adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer. Ms. Roney did not concur and felt that the objection against her sister-in-law, who was a circulator, was absurd and that she had with her a notarized affidavit along with the voter registration card verifying this. Ms. Roney also felt she was treated unfairly in that she was told she could not speak during the records examination when she observed others making comments and that staff did not follow procedures when making rulings on individual signatures. Mr. Herman verified that those allegations toward staff were not brought up at the December 7 hearing. Member Keith moved to adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer to

sustain the objection and the name of Shirley Roney not be printed on the February 5, 2008 ballot for the office of 19<sup>th</sup> District, Representative in Congress. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-1 with Member Walters voting in the negative.

The General Counsel presented *Sendejas v. Shabo*, 07SOEBGP500. The candidate, Miriam Shabo representing herself and Mike Kasper representing the objector were present in Chicago and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel stated the minimum number of signatures required was no fewer than 500 and the number of signatures submitted was 547. The number of signatures objected to was 361 and after a binder check was conducted, 312 of those were sustained and 48 overruled. Based on these results, the candidate's petition contained no more than 235 valid signatures which was 265 signatures below the statutory minimum of 500 required. The hearing officer also denied the candidate's Motion to Strike and Dismiss the Objector's petition after it was determined that the objector was sufficiently identified by name and address. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be sustained and the candidate not be certified to the ballot. Ms. Shabo indicated she believed her petition should be deemed valid and felt the records examination was conducted before the objection had any standing. Mr. Kasper agreed with the recommendation of the hearing examiner and explained that Ms. Shabo misunderstood the geographical location and that those signatures did not count because they reside outside of the district. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be sustained and the name of Miriam Shabo not be certified to the February 5, 2008 ballot. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Byrd v. Porter*, 07SOEBGP502. The candidate, Jarmon Porter, representing himself and Mike Kasper, representing the objector were present in Chicago and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel explained the minimum number of signatures required was no fewer than 500 and the number of signatures submitted was 851. A records examination was conducted on the 498 signatures objected to and it was determined that 390 were sustained and 106 signatures were overruled. The candidate also failed to file a Statement of Economic Interest with the Secretary of State and also failed to file the receipt within the statutory time frame. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the

objection be sustained and the candidate not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Mr. Porter stated a Motion to Dismiss and Strike was filed and no response was filed and that the objection should be thrown out. Mr. Kasper indicated a Motion to Strike was not served to him, therefore, he could not respond to such Motion. He further stated the candidate is prohibited from appearing on the ballot because he failed to file required Statement of Economic Interest with the Secretary of State's Office. The General Counsel indicated that a Motion to Strike was not a referenced factor in the hearing officer's decision and the other grounds for the objection were sufficient to sustain the objection. Member Keith moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel to sustain the objection and the candidate not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 7-1 with Member Walters voting in the negative.

The General Counsel presented *Flynn v. Jagla*, 07SOEBGP504. The candidate, Stan Jagla, representing himself, and Matthew Flam on behalf of the objector were present in Chicago and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel indicated the minimum number of signatures required was 827 and the candidate submitted 1,004. The number of signatures objected to was 268 and after a binder check was conducted, 150 of those were sustained and 188 overruled. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be overruled. Mr. Flamm stated that some of the petition signatures did not remotely match the voter registration and felt that every line was not individually compared. Mr. Jagla indicated he concurred with the recommendation of the hearing examiner. The General Counsel agreed that the hearing officer reviewed each signature ruling in column B, signature not genuine, on the recap sheets. He also stated that a signature that was printed and not written is not a valid basis for objection. After discussion, Member Keith moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel to overrule the objection and certify the name of Stan Jagla to the Primary Election ballot. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Ferritto v. Abernathy*, 07SOEBGP505. Matthew Flamm was present in Chicago on behalf of the Objector and no one was present in the Springfield office. The General Counsel stated the minimum number of signatures required was no less than 600 and the

number of signatures submitted was 13 on the petition. The heading on the petition lists the office as Representative in Congress and the heading on the Statement of Candidacy lists the office as United States House of Representatives. The Objector alleges this was a violation of 10 ILCS 5/7-10 that the nominating papers specifically identify the office being sought, and the heading of each sheet shall be the same. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be sustained due to lack of sufficient number of valid signatures and that the name of Iain Abernathy not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. The General Counsel recommended the Board dismiss the designation of office portion of the objection in that there is no statutory requirement the designation of office be identical on the petition sheets and the Statement of Candidacy. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer to sustain the objection on the basis of lack of valid signatures and the name of Iain Abernathy not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Couvall v. Kalbfleisch*, 07SOEBGP506. Scott Summers was present in Chicago on behalf of the candidate and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel indicated the minimum number of signatures required was 600 and the candidate submitted 374. The candidate also filed a Motion to Recalculate Signature Requirement alleging the minimum number signatures required for the Green Party was incorrectly calculated by the State Board of Elections. The General Counsel concurred with the hearing officer's recommendation that the objection be sustained due to lack of valid signatures and the Motion to Recalculate should be denied and the name of David Kalbfleisch should not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Mr. Summers disagreed with the recommendation of the hearing officer and felt the signature requirement for the Green Party should be accorded the same methodology as the Democrat and Republican Parties. The General Counsel indicated that the default requirement of 600 is still less than the requirements for the Democrat and Republican parties. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer and General Counsel to sustain the objection and the name of David Kalbfleisch not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Aron, Dehmlow, Alexander v. Johnson*, 07SOEBGP509. Michael Dorf was present on behalf of the objectors in Chicago and no one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel stated the minimum number of signatures required was 1,000 and the number submitted was 1,514. The number of signatures objected to was 824 and after a records examination it was determined that 673 signatures were sustained. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be sustained due to lack of valid signatures. Mr. Dorf also concurred with the recommendation. Member Smart moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objection be sustained and Jerry Johnson should not be printed on the Primary Election ballot. Member McGuffage seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Martin v. Hill*, 07SOEBGP510. No one was present in either office. The General Counsel indicated the minimum number of signatures required was no less than 5,000 and no more than 10,000 and the number submitted on the petition was 560. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing examiner that the nominating papers of Norm Hill be deemed invalid and that his name not appear on the Primary Election ballot. Member Smart moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing examiner and the General Counsel. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Martin v. Psak*, 07SOEBGP511. Mike Simmons on behalf of the candidate and Mike Psak were both present in Chicago and no one was present in Springfield. The minimum number of signatures required was no less than 5,000 and nor more than 10,000 and 5,554 signatures were submitted on the candidate's petition. The number of signatures objected to was 221. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing officer that the objector's petition should be dismissed and the candidate's Motion to Strike and Dismiss the Objector's Petition should be granted and the name Mike Psak should appear on the Primary Election ballot. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing examiner and the General Counsel that the objection be overruled and the name of Mile Psak appear on the Primary Election ballot. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Linkenheld, Jr. v. Kegarise*, 07SOEBGP517. John Countryman, representing the objector and Donald Laxton, representing the candidate were both present in the Chicago office. No one was present in Springfield. The General Counsel stated the number of signatures required was no fewer than 500 and the number submitted on the candidate's petition was 558. The number of signatures objected to was 172 and after conducting a binder check it was determined that 113 signatures were sustained and 59 overruled, which lowered the number of valid signatures to 55 below the required minimum. This A Motion for Default was filed by the Objector against the Candidate for failure to appear at the initial hearing of the State Officers Electoral Board on November 19, 2007. That Motion was denied as the hearing examiner found that the appearance was timely filed. The General Counsel concurred with the recommendation of the hearing examiner that objection be sustained and that the name of Charlotte Kegarise not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Mr. Laxton stated that the hearing examiner failed to address the Motion to Dismiss and the records check was conducted without proper notice to either party and asked the Board to overrule the recommendation of the hearing examiner. Mr. Countryman disagreed and gave an overview of the events leading up to the hearing and requested the Board accept the recommendation of the hearing officer. After lengthy discussion, Member Brady moved to accept the recommendation of the hearing examiner and General Counsel to sustain the objection and the name of Charlotte Kegarise not be certified to the Primary Election ballot. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

The General Counsel presented *Mayers v. Keyes*; 07SOEBGP520. No one was present from the parties in either office. The General Counsel explained The State Board of Elections received what purported to be an objection on December 12, 2007 by Richard B. Mayers to the candidacy of Alan Keys. The objection stated that he was a registered voter but since then we have received notice that Mr. Mayers had canceled his voter registration effective immediately which means the objection would have no standing. Furthermore, the objection does not state any provision of the Election Code that has been violated. It was noted that proper Notice of today's meeting was sent to both parties. The General Counsel recommended the Board strike the objection as not being in compliance with 10-8 of the Election Code in that Mr. Mayers is not a legal voter in the State of Illinois and he did not state the

specific statutory citations that have been violated. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the recommendation of the General Counsel to dismiss the objection. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed by roll call vote of 8-0.

With there being no further business before the State Officers Electoral Board, Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess until call of the Chairman. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously. The meeting recessed at approximately 1:10 p.m.

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Chairman Porter called the meeting to order at 10:37 a.m. and led everyone in the pledge of allegiance. All members were present.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess to the State Officers Electoral Board at 10:38 a.m. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The meeting of the State Board of Elections resumed at 11:15 a.m. with a reading of clarifications or changes to the October 15, 2007 minutes. Member McGuffage moved to adopt the minutes with the changes suggested by Member Keith. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

Executive Director White noted that the Agenda was amended due to a typographical error at item 31 and he submitted a letter from Chicago's Board of Election Commissioner's Executive Director, Lance Gough, which should have been included in the packet before page 17. Mr. White also presented a complimentary letter from Senate Republican Leader Frank Watson regarding the first day of filings and an article from the Peoria Journal Star that ranks Illinois in the top 10 for its campaign disclosure laws, electronic filing, and accessibility.

The first item on the Executive Director's agenda was preparations for the General Primary Election. He indicated that a record 650 candidates filed by 8:00 a.m., were processed, and entered into our database by 10:30 a.m. Further, that a total of 960 candidates filed during the week long period including 176 on the last day. He thanked Directors Mossman, Steve Flowers, and the great efforts of the entire SBE staff for making the filing period a great success and reiterated that many compliments were received. Chairman Porter said that the Board is grateful to Mr. White and the staff for all of the good work they have done and that they serve the State of Illinois well.

Mr. White continued with information on the Special Judicial Filing and Presidential Filing periods and corresponding objection periods. He advised the Board of several dates in December when they may have to meet. Finally, Mr. White presented a list of judges' schools for the General Primary 2008 for informational purposes which concluded his pre election report.

A contingency plan for the February Primary Election was revisited. Mr. White said that election officials and the Governor's office had been contacted and McHenry County Clerk Kathie Schultz indicated that this matter will be discussed and a committee formed to address the issue. At the Governor's office's suggestion, we contacted the Illinois Emergency Management Agency for coordination of efforts.

The Director indicated that staff will be filming a public service announcement, informing the public that we will have the earliest primary in Illinois' history. Also, that we have purchased 150 copies of a video on voters with disabilities. The video will be instrumental in training of election workers and election judges. Mr. White affirmed that the Governor signed the elections omnibus bill 662. Pursuant to law, this bill ensures independent candidates the chance to file in June.

A special congressional election may be required in the 14<sup>th</sup> District as Congressman Hastert has indicated he may tender his resignation prior to the end of this year.

Member McGuffage commented that this would be the type of election where mail in ballots would save a lot of time without having to open polling places for just one election taking place in eight counties. He also commented on the videos and PSA's and suggested that the video's be made available to the schools and asked the director to research it's feasibility. He added that there are a lot of young people that aren't getting the proper education in government and therefore are not voting.

Director White continued his report with a HAVA update indicated that he anticipated receiving a check from the Secretary of State's office. The \$40,000 agreed amount will be paid shortly as the SOS has already cut a check to the Comptroller. This payment will satisfy the last of the 3 reimbursements that were required by the EAC audit.

Mr. White indicated that Dianne Felts, Director of Voting Systems and Standards, recommended three items for interim approval. The first is approval of the marking pens for Sequoia's Optech 400-C (WinETP 1.14.3) and Optech Insight Plus (APX K2.12, HPX K1.44) with WinEDS 3.1.074. The pens are the Eberhard Faber, the Uni-ball Signo RT, and the Uni-ball VISION EXACT. She added that none of these pens were as easy to use as the Micron regarding smudging, but they work well and are cheaper. She recommends approval of the three pens as long as the ballots' paper quality is of the same weight as our test. Vice Chairman Schneider moved for interim approval of the Eberhard Faber, Uniball Visiion Exact and Univall Signo RT marking pens to be used on the Insite and Optech 400C at Sequoia's expense and Cook and Chicago Boards are buying and supplying the pens. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The second approval is for hardware modifications to the Edge2Plus, the vendor's direct recording electronic device. The modification centers around the effect of static electricity on the machine's printer. Member Smart moved to grant approval for the General Primary Election of February 5, 2008, for the Sequoia Edge2plus Model 300, Firmware 1.2.33 hardware upgrade of the electrostatic discharge protection. Member Walters seconded the motion

The last approval was in answer to a request from Lance Gough, Executive Director of the Chicago Board of Elections, who indicated that they will manually audit and report on vote totals in split precincts in time for the Board's certification of the February 5, 2008 General Primary election results. As the Sequoia WinEDS 3.1.074 has interim approval through January 2009, extension of the approval was not necessary.

The remaining items on the Executive Director's report were for informational purposes. Mr. White said he was pleased to announce reinstatement of the SBE agency newsletter. He indicated that he would eventually like to combine both the Illinois Voter Registration System (IVRS) letter and the Agency Newsletter. Member Walters moved to authorize Mr. White to publish these newsletters. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The next item was information on the Campaign Disclosure Downlink Seminar. Mr. White submitted the flyer publicizing the 12 locations statewide and that the seminar will be available as a streaming video broadcast which may be viewed from home computers.

Fiscal status reports, Help America Vote Fund and the two year plan of staff activity for November and December were presented for the Board's information.

Director White told the Board that staff is preparing the FY09 budget already and we will have that for presentation to the Board in January. He said that they will be coming back with an aggressive budget and ask for the resources that we need.

On a final note, Mr. White said that very little HAVA spending activity occurred this past month.

The Chairman recognized Mr. Dennis Allen who filed a Motion for Reconsideration and was present for consideration of civil penalty assessment for failure to comply with a Board Order and asked General Counsel, Steve Sandvoss, to summarize the case. Mr. Sandvoss indicated that this matter was carried over from the October meeting. He said that the Respondent failed to file the February 2007 Pre-election report, that the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and that the committee filed the June 2007 semi-annual report rather than the required Pre election report. On August 22, 2007, the committee was ordered to file the February 2007 Pre-election report within 30 days of the effective date of the order or face a civil penalty not to exceed \$5,000.00 pursuant to the Election Code. The General Counsel recommended assessing the civil penalty of \$7,950.00. Mr. Allen said that correspondence was going to the secretary and not directly to him. He indicated that the committee members had been replaced and that the monies in the account would be used to pay a judgment. Mr. Allen said that the committee would dissolve and file a final report. Member Keith moved to deny the motion to reconsider and assess no further penalty under the August 22<sup>nd</sup> Order. Member Brady seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously by roll call.

General Counsel Sandvoss summarized the matter of *SBE v. Committee to Elect John A. Lartz*, S9158, 07CD038. No one appeared for the respondent. Member Smart moved to assess \$5,000 for failure to obey the Board's Order. Member Rednour seconded the matter which passed by 7-0-1 vote, with Member Brady voting present.

The General Counsel summarized the *SBE v. AARC of Illinois*, S9099, 06DS178 and 07JS057 and noted that this matter was carried over from the October meeting so that the Respondent could confer with the officers of the committee, however no one was present for the hearing. He recommended that the appeal be denied and the committee assessed a civil penalty of \$4,675.00. Member Smart moved and Member Rednour seconded a motion to adopt the recommendation of the General Counsel to deny the appeal and assess a \$4,500.00 civil penalty. The motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Porter called the appeal of *SBE v. Friends of Todd Stroger for President of the Cook County Board of Commissioners*, S9283, 06D119, a matter that was carried over from the October meeting. Mr. Burton Odelson appeared for the Respondent. Mr. Richard Means, attorney for Mr. Peraica in another matter, filed a Motion to Consolidate this hearing with an outside complaint involving Messrs. Peraica and Stroger. The Motion was not considered at this time and was set over to be heard during the time scheduled for the Peraica complaint. The Chairman cautioned Mr. Means not to interrupt when the Board is discussing something. Member McCuffage moved to fine the committee \$14,201 and deny the appeal. Member Keith seconded the motion which failed by 4-3-1 vote, with Member Brady abstaining and Member Smart, Walters and Vice Chairman Schneider voting against the motion. Member Smart moved to deny the appeal and fine the committee \$25,581.64 and Vice Chairman accepted

the second. The motion carried by 5-1-1-1 vote. Member Brady abstained; Member McGuffage voted present; and Chairman Porter voted no.

The Chairman called *Peraica v. Friends of Todd H. Stroger for President of the Cook County Board of Commissioners*, 07CD071 a complaint following closed hearing. Both parties agreed to have the matter heard in open session. The General Counsel summarized the case and agreed with the hearing officer's recommendation that the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds but to take no further action in light of the fact that the penalty portion of the matter has been resolved and deny the motion to consolidate. After hearing from both sides, Vice Chairman Schneider moved to adopt the General Counsel and Hearing Officer's recommendations; to deny the Motion to Consolidate and no further action be taken and as the penalty has already been taken care of. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed 7-0-1 with Member Brady abstaining.

New appeals of campaign disclosure fines that the hearing officer recommended be granted were presented. Appearances were acknowledged for Giovanni Rendacci and Courtney Nottage for Friends of Lewandowski, S8800; Thomas Bastian for the Committee to Elect Johnson, S7853; and Alan King, Chairman for S8984; all three agreed with the hearing officers' recommendations. Vice Chairman Schneider moved and Member McGuffage seconded a motion to grant the appeals. The motion passed unanimously by voices in unison. Appeals were granted in: *SBE v. Friends of Charlotte R. Moore*, L1921, 07AE019; *SBE v. 11<sup>th</sup> Ward Democratic Party Campaign Committee*, S787, 07AE025; *SBE v. Committee to Elect Johnson*, S7853, 07CE061; *SBE v. Friends of Dan Lewandowski*, S8800, 06AG097; *SBE v. Friends of Kwame Raoul*, S8749, 06AG106; and *SBE v. Riverdale Mayor Finance Committee*, S8984, 07JS013.

Member Keith moved to continue the following appeals to the December 6<sup>th</sup> meeting: *SBE v. Committee to Elect Edward "Ed" Russell*, L13781, 07AE006; *SBE v. Friends of Judy Stearns*, L14206, 07MA018; and *SBE v. Frankfort Township Democratic Organization*, S8789, 07JS052. Member Smart seconded the motion with no objection.

The Chairman asked for a vote as to new appeals where the hearing officer recommended and the general counsel agreed the appeals be denied. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to deny the appeals in the following cases: *SBE v. Friends of William J. P. Banks*, L811, 071C040; *SBE v. Community Park of Hanover Park*, L1227, 07AE029; *SBE v. Citizens for Cole*, L9291, 07AE004 & 07AE020; *SBE v. Citizens for Cappleman*, L13487, 07JS076; *SBE v. Fioretti for Alderman*, L13544, 07AC029; *SBE v. Friends for Eric P. McKennie*, L13815, 07JS073; *SBE v. Citizens for Munoz*, S5774, 07AC043; and *SBE v. C.C.D.P. (Catherine, Carle, David & Patricia) Party*, S9365, 07AE027. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

The Chairman acknowledged the appearance of Peter Zelchenko in the matter of *SBE v. Citizens for Peter Zelchenko*, L13601, 07CP031. Mr. Zelchenko offered his response to the complaint and Mr. Sandvoss differed with the respondent as Mr. Zelchenko was a candidate at the February Consolidate Election and since he was running he was a participating committee and required to file a pre election report regardless of how much money is raised or spent. Further, that Mr. Zelchenko voluntarily filed the statement of organization and has put himself under the jurisdiction of the SBE and is now required to file subsequent reports. The General Counsel recommended the Board deny the appeal and assess the penalty. Member Smart moved and Member Rednour seconded a motion to grant the appeal. The motion carried by 5-3 vote with Members Brady, Keith and Vice Chairman Schneider voting no.

Chairman Porter recognized the *pro se* appearance of Mr. Michael Mayden for *SBE v. Citizens to Elect Michael Mayden*, S9027, 07JS071. Mr. Mayden asked for leniency on the additional \$1,500 that has been assessed. The General Counsel agreed with the recommendation of the hearing examiner and noted that 2 previous semi-annual reports were filed late. Member Keith moved to adopt the recommendation of the hearing officer and general

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counsel and deny the appeal and Member Brady seconded the motion. Mr. Mayden submitted a settlement offer of \$150. Member Keith stayed his motion. Member Smart moved to accept the settlement agreement and Member McGuffage seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-3 with Members Brady, Keith and Vice Chairman Schneider voting against the motion. Member Keith withdrew his motion.

*SBE v. Friends of Michelle Harris, S9311, 07AC035* was considered. Mr. Sandvoss agreed with the hearing examiner to grant and deny the appeal. Vice Chairman Schneider moved to accept the hearing officer and general counsel's recommendations to deny and grant the appeal as specified by the hearing officer's report and grant the appeal regarding the \$5,000 check dated February 26, 2007 and deny the appeal regarding the \$1,500 check dated February 9, 2007. Further, that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment or \$150. Member Smart seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison and none opposed.

The General Counsel presented a payment plan for the Asbestos Workers Heat & Frost Insulators Local Union #1. Three hundred twenty five dollars has been paid towards the penalty of \$1,225 leaving a balance of \$900 to be paid in 3 equal payments. Member Smart moved to accept the payment plan. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

Mr. Sandvoss indicated that the next two items were informational. One is a list of candidate committees whose candidates potentially face ballot forfeiture for the primary election, Feb. 5, 2008 and the other is a listing of committees who have paid their civil penalties. Potential ballot forfeiture and payment of civil penalties were submitted for informational purposes.

A complaint following public hearing, *SBE v. Citizens for Hawkins, S9222, 07CD046* was considered. Member Smart moved and Member Rednour seconded a motion to issue an order specifically ordering the committee to file semi annual report for December, 2006. Further, that it must be filed within 30 days of the Board's order. The motion passed unanimously.

Item 3.a.29 was continued to executive session.

Mr. Sandvoss presented a review of executive session minutes and indicated that there is no longer a need for confidentiality and public access should be allowed. He added that the Open Meetings Act does not require a disclosure of the verbatim recording even in the event that the minutes themselves are released to the public. A separate Board vote to specifically authorize the release would be necessary. Member Keith moved as to the minutes of the meetings of Executive Session of the State Board of Elections from October 2005 through September 2007, that those minutes be released except for the specific ones contained in the memorandum of Mr. Sandvoss and that apply only to the minutes and not to any verbatim recordings or other notes concerning the meetings. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

Discussion was had regarding opposition of JCAR to a proposed rule. It was decided to withdraw the rule. Member McGuffage moved to withdraw the proposed rule and seek legislation. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess to Executive Session for the consideration of a complaint following closed preliminary hearing for litigation, discussion of pending litigation and personnel matters. Member Walters seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The Board retired to executive session at 1:39 p.m. and returned to open session at 1:57 p.m.

Member Keith moved on Case 07CSD69 to find that the complaint was filed on justifiable grounds and have the matter moved forward to public hearing. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Member Keith moved to direct the general counsel in accordance with the discussions in Executive Session as to representation in the case filed by Mr. Schultz against the members individually and as Board members and also relative to the pending request of the Attorney General regarding filing relative to independent candidates that it would be withdrawn. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved that the State Board of Elections stand adjourned until December 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:30 a.m. Member Rednour seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The State Board of Elections adjourned at 2:02 p.m. and the following commended at 2:08 p.m.

Chairman Porter asked the Board to come back into session and retake the roll. All members were present. He indicated that they came back into session to hear Ms. Jean Kazmarek, co-chair of the DuPage Chapter of Illinois Ballot Integrity Project. Ms. Kazmarek indicated that substantial evidence has been reported on the lack of security, accuracy and reliability of the Diebold TSX voting systems and submitted a survey for the board's perusal.



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Chairman Porter called the meeting to order at 10:45 a.m. and led everyone in the pledge of allegiance. Roll call indicated that Member Rednour was absent and her proxy was held by Member Keith.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess to the State Officers Electoral Board at 10:45 a.m. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The meeting of the State Board of Elections resumed at 11:25 a.m. Member Keith moved to adopt the minutes of the November 14<sup>th</sup> meeting. Vice Chairman Schneider seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

Executive Director White asked to move the certification of the February primary ballot to the end of the meeting. He indicated that unresolved objections will be certified with a notation "objection pending". As the objections are resolved, staff will send amended certifications to the appropriate jurisdictions. Mr. White reminded the Board that they will have to meet each time a withdrawal is submitted. The Chairman moved ballot certification to the last item on the Agenda prior to "Other Business".

He continued with an update of the petition and objection filing period. He noted that only one vacancy would be filled in the special Judicial Filing Period, a county judgeship in Massac County. He gave the board the dates they would have to meet if objections were filed in this vacancy or the Republican President and Delegate filing. He confirmed that the Board will meet Friday, December 21 at 10:30 a.m. via videoconference to certify Republican Presidential and Delegate candidates. Finally, he said that a special election to fill the vacancy of Congressman Hastert may be held in conjunction with the February 5 primary. Further, that if February 5 is designated, a special filing period will be conducted December 10-17.

Mr. White continued with a request from the Department of Defense's Federal Voting Assistance Program (FVAP) to assist in facilitating military and overseas voting for the Presidential elections. He presented a letter from Cris Cray,

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FVAP coordinator which asks the SBE to encourage local election officials to utilize the FVAP feature to electronically complete the Federal Postcard Application to register to vote and request an absentee ballot. Mr. White asked for a motion of the board to direct staff to notify election authorities of the program and encourage their participation. Member Brady so moved and Member McGuffage seconded the motion which passed unanimously. This matter will be revisited at the clerk's Advisory Committee meeting.

The Director submitted legislative proposals for 2008, which are not presented for adoption at this time. These proposals and other initiatives will be considered at the January meeting and will be placed on the agenda for final action.

Mr. White concluded his report with informational fiscal status reports and the two year plan of staff activity for December.

The General Counsel began his report with an appeal carried over from November wherein the hearing officer recommended the appeal be denied. Mr. Donald Kean, Treasurer, was present for the respondent in *SBE v. Frankfort Township Democratic Organization*, S8789, 07KS052. Mr. Sandvoss agreed with the hearing officer to deny the appeal and assess a fine of \$475.00. Mr. Kean made a settlement offer of \$150. Member Smart moved and Chairman Porter seconded a motion to accept the \$150 settlement. The motion passed 6-2 with Members Brady and Keith voting no.

Mr. Sandvoss presented *SBE v. Citizens for Dwight Welch*, L3237, 07AE031 and agreed with the hearing officer to grant the new appeal. Member Smart moved to adopt the hearing officer and general counsel's recommendations. Member Keith seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

The Chairman called three new appeals of campaign disclosure fines where the hearing officer recommended the appeals be denied. Mr. Sandvoss indicated that he agreed with the recommendation of the hearing officer. Member Keith moved and Member Smart seconded a motion to adopt the recommendations of the hearing officer and general counsel and deny the appeals. The motion passed unanimously. Appeals were denied in *SBE v. Cunningham Campaign Committee*, L9059, 07AE032; *SBE v. Citizens Action Party*, L14011, 07JS093; and *SBE v. Citizens for Sycamore Education*, L14019, 07JS094.

Mr. Sandvoss submitted a list of committees that have been assessed a civil penalty for delinquent filing of December 2007 and June 2007 Semi annual reports, schedule A-1s in conjunction with the February 2007 and April 2007 elections, and multiple assessments. These violations were not appealed and should be issued a Final Board Order. Two candidates are on the ballot, Friends of "Bill Dock" Walls/Walls for Mayor and Neighbors for Naisy Dolar. Member Smart moved to assess a final order regarding the referenced candidates involved in certifying the ballot and the amount of the fine will be reduced by staff personnel.

Fines were paid by the following candidates: Derrick Prince, William Davis, William Walls III, and Michael Mayden. A list of candidates who face possible ballot forfeiture was presented for informational purposes. Richard Means, representing Judy Baar Topinka was acknowledged. He said that his client was not notified as to some of these matters and only after the appeals period passed and she would like to get back into the appeal process. Further, that she filed 1 day late; is not on the February General Primary ballot; and will have a proposal by the January meeting.

Mr. Sandvoss presented a list of committees who made payment of outstanding civil penalties for the period Nov 8, 2007 to November 28, 2007.

Chairman Porter called for a motion for a short recess. Mr. Keith moved and Chairman Porter seconded the motion which passed unanimously by ayes in unison. The board recessed at 12:30 p.m.

The Board returned at 12:45 p.m. Chairman Porter continued L17249 to the January meeting with notice to the respondent.

Vice Chairman Schneider moved that all candidates be certified whose names are listed on the proposed official certification for the 2008 General Primary Election other than the name of Scott Summers, Green Party candidate for Congressman from the 16th Congressional District and Norm Hill, Republican Party candidate for U.S. Senate. In addition, the words "objection pending" shall be included next to the names of those candidates whose objections have not been disposed of and provided that the Board hereby directs the staff to issue an amended certification removing the names of any candidate who fails to pay their assessed civil penalty within 30 days of the effective date of the written order to do so.

There being nothing further before the board, Vice Chairman Schneider moved to recess until 10:30 a.m., December 21, 2007 or the call of the Chair. Member Brady seconded the motion which passed by 8 ayes in unison.

The meeting adjourned at 1:00 p.m.



This year we focused our statewide voter public awareness program on the new early primary election date, early voting and grace period registration.

The 2008 public information campaign on early voting began in October, 2007 by publishing 5,000 pamphlets explaining the state law that allows voters – for the first time in an Illinois Presidential election – to go to an early voting center and vote without having to give a reason or an excuse for wanting to vote early. Pamphlets were distributed to county clerks and other election authorities and forty pamphlets were given to the State Library. Others were distributed as needed.

The effort to reach Hispanic audiences was expanded by distributing radio and television Public Service Announcements in Spanish as well as English. The Illinois Information Service videotaped and produced PSAs featuring Board employees John Levin and Rose Rodriguez announcing the moved up February 5 Primary Election and the January 14-31 time period for early voting centers. That message was delivered about December 13 by IIS to 267 radio stations and 88 television stations. Also, Rose personally contacted 13 radio stations and four television stations that target Spanish audiences.

A news release on early voting was distributed December 13:

- E-mailed to SBE's media list of 44 journalists
- Hand-delivered to the Statehouse Press Room
- Faxed to a dozen news organizations that routinely receive our news releases via this route
- Rose translated the news release and sent it to a dozen journalists
- Blast faxed to 180 radio and television stations by IIS
- Posted on the SBE website

A news release template also was sent to election authorities at this time so they could announce early voting details in their jurisdictions.

A second news release was distributed January 10 as a reminder that early voting would begin the following Monday. Early voting also was mentioned in news releases October 16, November 26, December 2 and January 2 as announcements were made on

the earliest start ever for an Illinois election; a record number of candidates filing at the SBE; changes in the election calendar caused by moving the primary date forward; and grace period registration.

Furthermore, I often mentioned the February 5 Primary and early voting when discussing the upcoming election with reporters, as did Communications Consultant Al Manning.

In summary, Illinois news organizations received early voting information at a minimal cost to the SBE - every Illinois radio and television station; wire services and larger newspapers through individual contacts or correspondents in Springfield; and Hispanic news organizations. The news release, pamphlet and video PSAs are bundled on the SBE web site under "press releases."

Lastly, thanks to Al Manning for his efforts to get our message out to the public and media.

At the last State Board of Elections' (SBE) Advisory Committee of Election Officials meeting, some officials expressed concern with the General Primary Election being advanced to February 5th that the possibility of inclement weather could force closing and/or relocation of some polling places. The ensuing discussion broadened to include steps to be taken in the event of a natural disaster or other emergency event that may force the postponement of the election. In response, we reviewed Illinois' election law and the law and practices of other states.

Accordingly, the following memorandum is offered for your review and consideration.

**STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS  
ADVISORY MEMORANDUM**

There is no federal authority to direct cancellation or postponement of an election, state or federal.

In addition, there are no provisions in Illinois statutes that allow for the emergency postponement of an election. While other states have provisions that permit an official such as the Governor, Secretary of State, or Chief Election Official to declare an emergency and postpone an election, Illinois law is silent on this issue. The Governor does have authority to declare emergencies in specific instances for disaster relief or establishing a temporary seat of government, but not for elections.

The only section of the election code that remotely addresses this issue is contained in Section 18A-5(3) which makes general reference to provisional voting and suggests that a federal or state court order may extend the time for closing the polls beyond the time period established by State law.

As a precautionary measure, we suggest you contact your local state's attorney or legal counsel for advise and that jurisdictions have a pleading prepared in advance and a judge standing by for expedited action in extraordinary circumstances.

In the absence of any direct statutory authority to close or postpone elections, the SBE offers the following information in the name of statewide uniformity, preparedness, and guidance in the event of a disaster or emergency.

The following is intended to assist in planning for emergencies that may impact Election Day operations. Much of the information provided has been gleaned from the best practices and procedures of other states and contingency and disaster planning publications from the U.S. Election Assistance Commission.

Each election jurisdiction should develop some type of a contingency or Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP) that addresses what to do in case of an emergency on Election Day. The plan should seek to ensure the continuity of the election process by anticipating, assessing, and managing potential problems.

Below is a summary overview of matters to consider in planning for an emergency Election Day situation and suggestions for establishing a DRP.

- There is no way one can totally prepare for an election day disaster, however, one of the most important and useful tools is development of a ready listing of emergency telephone numbers, faxes and emails addresses of key staff and contacts including your local Emergency Management/Disaster Agency, law enforcement, fire and medical services. Also check to see if your jurisdiction (county/city) has a DRP.
- Have a ready supply of emergency and backup supplies, including backup power sources.
- Have a back-up listing of alternative polling places.
- Back-up voting equipment.
- Listing of emergency back-up poll workers.
- Back-up communication generator, cell phones.
- Access to four wheel drive emergency vehicles.
- Alternative Election Central location.
- Plans to alert voters and news media to election polling places changes and other announcements.
- Provide instructions for judges of election in the event of power outages during Election Day.
- Operational procedures in the event of a bomb threat.
- Examine storage facilities utilized for computer systems and voting systems.
- Establish evacuation procedures in your office for staff to follow.
- Be prepared to respond to media and arrange for press conference.
- Contact your election vendor to inquire if they have an emergency plan in place.
- Develop a complete "to-do" check list of items to be performed. Review and update regularly.

The above listing is by no means exhaustive and intended only as a helpful tool for beginning your Election Day contingency planning.

We hope that you find the above information useful in preparing for the 2008 elections.

## Election Legislative Issues 2008

1. Per a request from Steve Sandvoss; modify Sections 10-8, 10-10 and 28-4; these changes deal with petitions for constitutional amendments and statewide advisory questions. In addition, it allows for getting objections to candidates within 2 days of the end of the objection filing period (10 ILCS 5/10-8). Removes the "registered mail" requirement, and gives the SBE flexibility as to how we send the objections and call to the candidate. In addition, it amends 10-10 to change the 3-5 day period for the first meeting of the SOEB to 3-5 days following the last day to object. This would eliminate the need for an additional "initial" meeting of the SOEB (similar to the meeting held on Wednesday, November 14).
2. Requests from Member McGuffage:
  - a. reintroduce House Bill 4672, first introduced in 2006; outlines Board remedies for campaign finance issues
  - b. require that the Chairman and Treasurer of Illinois Political Action Committees to be different people
  - c. eliminate in-person absentee voting – extend early voting to the Monday before the election (delete 19-2.1 and amend 19A-15(a))
3. Per a request from Kyle Thomas, consider allowing federal committees to access the pre-ballot request website.
4. Per the Legal Department, amend 7A-1 to clarify declarations of candidacy for judges.
5. Per a request from Rupert Borgsmiller, close the loophole in Section 9-10(b) - the Dave Sullivan amendment.
6. Per a request from the Disclosure Department, amend Sections 9-1.7 and 1.8 to mirror the definition used for candidates (“take action necessary”) so it applies to referendum/advisory questions, etc. committees.
7. Per a request from Dianne Felts, amend Sections 24C-2 and 24C-15 to allow for the SBE to develop a scanner for use in redundant counts and retabs.
8. Per the Legal Department, add language to 24B-20 specifying that undervotes be identified for statewide constitutional offices only. This will make Section 24B consistent with the rest of the Election Code.
9. Per the Legal Department, remove language which dictates that the SBE must establish guidelines for the placement of signs at polling places.
10. Per a request from the Legal Department, clean up ballot preparation language. If no candidate files or no write-ins are declared, under the office title, the Clerk should list “no candidate.”

11. Per a request from the Board, seek legislation (rather than administrative rulemaking) regarding imposition of a deadline for submission of amended canvasses.
12. Per Member Keith, this language clarifies what settlement authority, if any, the State Board of Elections has relative to campaign disclosure fines for violations other than those related to A-1 reports.
13. Per Member Keith, this language is a mandate to the Department of Revenue requiring their Debt Collection Division to pursue collection of fines imposed upon political committees by the State Board of Elections with a provision that said Department can determine whether or not said collection pursuits are “reasonable” or not and decline upon a case-by-case basis after evaluation and notification to the State Board of Elections.
14. Per Eric Donnewald, clean-up language from SB 662. Delete sentence in 1A-16 mandating information to be presented at the polls by first time voters.
15. Per a request from Member McGuffage, clarify the dates when a special congressional election is required. Permit the SBE, in consultation with the election authorities, to recommend said dates.

This means that our costs are reduced for collecting the data and therefore we can offer it at a lower cost.

## Computerized Voter Registration Data

The State Board of Elections compiles a database of voter registration information provided by the 110 [Illinois election jurisdictions](#).\* Illinois counties (and 8 cities) submit data to the Board electronically on a regular basis, usually nightly.\*\*

Voter data is available to *registered political committees for bonafide political purposes*. Use for commercial solicitation or other business purposes is prohibited. (Chapter 10 ILCS 5/4-8, 5-7, and 6-35, Illinois Compiled Statutes).

Files of computerized voter registration data are available on DVD or CD-ROM. The Board offers two [file formats](#) that are tailored to the information needs and processing capabilities of those requesting voter data.

**Please note: The Board provides files of voter data; the Board does not provide software to process voter data.**

\*Two counties (Calhoun and Edwards) do not provide computerized voter data to the Board. Calhoun County has about 2700 registered voters in the 17th Congressional, 49th Senate, and 97th Representative Districts. Edwards County has about 3400 registered voters in the 15th and 19th Congressional, 54th Senate, and 108th Representative Districts.

\*\*Although all election jurisdictions are scheduled to submit voter data on a nightly basis, nightly updates may occasionally fail due to communication problems. The Board typically can restore communication in 96 hours or less. Updates are saved and transmitted when communication is restored.





My name is Dan Baisden and I am the Treasurer for the Kankakee Federation of Labor C.O.P.E fund. We were recently fined for being late filing our semi-annual report. I am asking the State Board of Elections consider that starting on May 12, 2007 I was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer in my throat. Beginning May 29, 2007 I began treatment for this at the University of Chicago Hospital. I began chemotherapy and radiation treatments on May 29, 2007 and did not finish treatments until September 5, 2007. During this time frame I was on disability from work and was not able to drive due to the doses of fentinal and morphine that was given to me. On October 10, 2007 I went in for surgery at the University of Chicago Hospital for removal of my tonsils and lymphnodes in my neck. The surgery was stopped half way through due to a finding of additional hot spots of cancer. On October 31, 2007 I went in to surgery again and they were able to successfully remove all the Cancer. I was not able to return to work until November 27, 2007. All this information can be verified through the University of Chicago Hospital, Dr. Vokes, Dr. Haraf and Dr. Blairs offices.

I am asking that the Illinois State Board of Elections to please take this into consideration when making a decision on the outcome for the Kankakee Federation of Labor C.O.P.E fund. **REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Failing to File  
A Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Election

This Committee received three contributions of \$1000 each on 3/20/07, 4/4/07, and 4/2/07, for a total of \$3000, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1. In addition, this Committee had been assessed a civil penalty of \$1000 (not appealed, not paid) for delinquently filing the Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election; a civil penalty of \$100 (not appealed, reduced, paid) for failing to file a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Election; and a second civil penalty of \$100 (not appealed, reduced, paid) for failing to file a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Election. The total assessment is \$4000.

Angela Russell Perry, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Russell stated that the Committee held a fundraiser on 4/6/07; these contributions in question were received on that date. She posted the date on the check instead of the contribution date. It was an oversight on her part. On Richard Gaines' check she posted the wrong date. Attached are copies of the checks in question.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. Ms. Russell stated that these checks were received on the date of the fundraiser, April 6, 2007. This was during the 30 days prior to the election during which such contributions were required to be reported on a Schedule A-1. No Schedule A-1 was filed. However, since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, and since this was the first election for which this Committee failed to file required A-1s, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$300. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the civil penalty of \$1300 will be due and owing.



**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment For Delinquently Filing a D-1 Statement of Organization, Pre-Election Reports For the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election and the 2007 Consolidated Election and For Failure To File Schedule A-1 Forms for the 2007 Consolidated Election


The D-1 Statement of Organization was received on April 10, 2007, 56 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$1400. The Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election was received April 26, 2007, 9 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$500. The Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Election was received July 20, 2007, 11 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$2200. The Committee received five contributions of more than \$500, all from the candidate, prior to the 2007 Consolidated Election, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1; the total Schedule A-1 civil penalty is \$2143.90. The total outstanding assessment is \$6243.90. Civil penalties had also been assessed for \$4629.56 for failing to report contributions on a Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, but because the contributions were from the candidate, the committee was given a one time amnesty for those Schedule A-1 violations for that election.

Judith I. Stearns, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and an Appeal Affidavit. In the Affidavit, Ms. Stearns referenced an attached two page letter. She was under the impression that she was not required to file until she received more than \$3,000 in contributions; she did not realize that spending one's own money counted towards the \$3,000 threshold. In late March she thought she might be approaching the \$3,000 threshold in contributions and, on the advice of her state rep, contacted Cris Cray at the Board. Ms. Cray answered her questions and helped her complete the D-1, but she did not file it at that time. On April 9, 2007, she received a letter from the Board advising her of the need to file a D-1. She did so on April 10, 2007. She contacted a CPA and made several calls to the Board and eventually made contact with Barb Mason in July to help her file her reports. She has less than \$100 in her account and is owed more than \$10,500. She stresses that she received misinformation and was totally inexperienced; those being the reasons for her late filings. Her mistakes were entirely unintentional.

The Hearing was scheduled for October 24, 2007, at 10:00 a.m. in the Springfield office of the State Board of Elections. Judy Sterns appeared on behalf of her Committee. Barb Mason, the individual who filed electronic reports for the committee, also appeared on behalf of the Committee. Much of Ms. Stern's testimony mirrored her Appeal Affidavit. She was assisted in her campaign by her state representative who advised her that she had to file with the Board when she received contributions in excess of \$3,000. She didn't realize that her own money counted towards the threshold. She began mail-outs in December using her credit card. In mid-January she opened an account at a sign shop using her credit card. She was keeping track of outside contributions, but these were few in number and small in size. She won the consolidated primary and then began soliciting information about filing around the middle of March. She was advised by the state representative who was assisting her, to call Cris Cray at the Board. She sought advice from Ms. Cray and assistance on completing the D-1. It is not known what specific questions were asked. She also contacted a couple of CPAs asking advice as well. One told her that after she filed the D-1 that she was fine until July. In July, she finally was put in contact with Barb Mason who helped sort out all of her personal expenditures and then determined that the threshold was crossed January 2, 1007, not in April as she originally thought. Ms. Stearns had no idea how much of her own money she had spent or obligated until this point. She had not run a balance of how much was charged on her VISA until the election. She currently has \$69 left in her account. She stresses that these violations were unintentional. I asked her if she had been given the D-1 Notice of Obligation at the time she had filed her petitions, and she did not remember.

Section 10 ILCS 5/9-1.7 defines a 'local political committee' as a candidate, or any individual, trust, partnership, committee, association, corporation, or any other organization or group of persons which "(a) accepts contributions or grants or makes expenditures during any 12-month period in an aggregate amount exceeding \$3,000 on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for public office who are required by the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act to file statements of economic interest with the County Clerk, or on behalf of or in opposition to a candidate or candidates for election to the office of ward or township committeeman in counties of 3,000,000 or more population;..." The key phrase in this definition is "makes expenditures". Ms. Sterns, the candidate, made expenditures by charging items on her credit card, exceeding \$3,000 by early January. As expenditures, they count towards the \$3,000 threshold. She acknowledges being a novice and relying upon the advice of another office holder. She talks about seeking advice from various individuals, including Board employees in late March and in April; however, the \$3,000 threshold was crossed in early January, so deadlines for the D-1, the Schedule A-1s for the Consolidated Primary Election, the Pre-Election Report for the Consolidated Election, and possibly some Schedule A-1 filings for the Consolidated Election, had passed before any contact was made with the Board. In addition, the Board sent her a letter dated April 9, 2007; this is a generic letter sent by staff when information comes into its possession that would indicate that a committee may be required to file. When asked if she had received her D-5 Notice of Obligation when she filed her petitions, she wasn't sure since it had been so long ago. Ms. Sterns served as her own chairman and treasurer, and given her relative inexperience, I'm sure, in retrospect, she would agree that this may not have been a good idea due to the extreme pressures involved in running a campaign. Being a first time candidate in a difficult race would have been a very time consuming experience. However, her failure to file was due to her lack of understanding of the law; as far as information she may or may not have gotten from the Board, these phone calls were made well into the campaign.

The Board provides many educational resources, beginning with the D-5 she would have gotten when she filed her petitions, and all the materials available on the Board website. These materials would have answered any questions she had regarding her obligation to file disclosure. Therefore, I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. In regards to the Schedule A-1 penalties, since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, I also recommend that the A-1 penalties be reduced to 10% of the original assessment or \$214. That \$214, plus the penalties for delinquently filing the D-1 and the two pre-election reports total \$4,314. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the total amount of \$4,314 will be due and owing.





## Friends of Judy Stearns

When I made a decision to run for Alderman, Ward 4, City of Bloomington in December of '06, I received the following advice from a friend who had held public office in the State of Illinois for several years, "You do not need to file a committee until you have received more than \$3,000.00 in campaign contributions." I knew that I would not be soliciting or receiving contributions until after the 2/23/07 primary election, so I believed I had no reason to file a committee until at least I began to receive contributions. I had no idea and no reason to think that spending money on my own campaign was the same as receiving it. I further had no idea of the large cost of campaigning and opened an account at a printer for my direct mailings and authorized charges on my Visa card without always receiving a statement. Since I did not pay off my Visa card and have run a balance since the campaign, I feel as if I still have not actually paid off my campaign expenses. My current Visa balance is larger than my campaign expenditures.

My campaign was hotly contested with 4 others in the primary and a 10 year incumbent in the general election. This was my first time to run for any office or even to be seriously involved in a campaign. Self employed, I was not able to devote much time to my work or business in order to campaign full time.

In late March of '07, I realized I might approach the \$3,000.00 limit of contributions, so I then felt I should file a committee. A friend pulled up the forms for me and I began the first of several calls to Springfield to make sure I was filing correctly. I was told by the same friend as above that I should call Chris Cray, which I did. She was helpful in some questions I had about how to fill out the D-1, but she did not refer me to the election board, so I still did not realize I was late.

I received a letter from the State Board 4/9/07 advising me of the need to file a committee. On 4/10 I filed a D-1 form. I talked to Chris Cray at least one other time and I also made an appointment with a CPA in Bloomington to see if I was doing the right thing, but she could not advise me. I made calls to the Board of Elections on 4/3, 4/6, 4/10/07 and on 7/13 and 7/17, finally convincing someone at the Board to give me the name of someone who could help me because I realized I was not capable of filing the 7/20 report myself. At last I contacted Ms. Barbara Mason who I was able to contract with to file my 7/20 report.

I then received an amnesty letter from you on 9/30/07. The next day I received a letter dated 4/30/07 that notified me of a civil penalty. Although the letter is dated 4/30/07, it is assessing a penalty for reports received in July of '07.

At this time I have a remainder of \$97.00 left in my committee fund, although I still owe over \$10,500 to myself. Again, my Visa balance still owing is greater than my campaign deficit—so I still feel as if I have not yet paid for my campaign.

In conclusion, the misinformation I received combined with my complete inexperience in running for office were the reason my committee was not filed in time. My mistakes


were entirely unintentional and were made because even calling the State Board numerous times did not give me the understanding that spending and receiving were the same. When I at last realized that I had not filed properly, I contacted 2 professionals—one in Bloomington who could not help and at last Barbara Mason, who was a great help, without whom, I am afraid I still would be attempting to do this correctly. Had I not found Barbara, I intended to make a trip to Springfield to speak directly with the State Board before 7/20.

My attempts to get the correct information and my willingness to hire an expert are, I believe, evidence that I put forth a sincere effort to file correctly.

The campaign was a tremendous sacrifice, financially, emotionally, and physically and my business and personal life suffered more than I ever thought they would. I am still recovering while striving hard to serve my constituents and be the best possible alderman I can be.

I sincerely thank you for your consideration of my explanation and look forward to meeting with you.


**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing  
Schedule A-1 Reports for the 2007 Consolidated Election

This Committee received four contributions of more than \$500 on 3/19/07, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1. The total assessment is \$2538.83.

Gary Seneczyn, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Seneczyn stated that these contributions from the four contributors were to help this Committee defray the cost of their holiday celebration, which was held in December. These funds were used only for that purpose and no other. In support of that statement, he includes a copy of a letter directed to Representative Holbrook thanking him for the pledge made to help fund the annual holiday celebration. Mr. Seneczyn further states that they were asked if their Club was going to participate in the upcoming election and their filed response was no. Once he had filed that with the Board, he thought no more about it until the next due report. In the next report, he listed these gentlemen and the money received from them. There was no intent nor was it purposely done to try and hide anything from the Board. He asks that his Club not be penalized for his lack of knowledge or understanding.

I contacted Mr. Seneczyn by telephone and questioned him further as to the Committee's activities in regards to the 2007 Consolidated Election. Based upon his Affidavit, my conversation with him, the letter to Representative Holbrook, and the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report filed by this Committee, it is determined that this Committee did not participate in the 2007 Consolidated Election and should have filed a Statement of Nonparticipation rather than a Pre-Election Report. The filing of the Pre-Election Report was the result of some confusion on his part. I recommend that the Appeal be granted, as this Committee met the requirements set forth in Section 100.70(d) of Board Rules and Regulations establishing itself in this election as a nonparticipating political committee, and as such, is not required to report contributions of more than \$500 received during the 30 days prior to the election on a Schedule A-1 form.






This Committee received 1 contribution of \$25,000 on 4/12/07, but failed to list it on a Schedule A-1. This contribution was reported on the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report. The assessed penalty is \$25,000.

Robert J Sprague, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Sprague stated that he filed Non-Participation Reports for the February 27, 2007, and April 17, 2007 elections and therefore is not required to file an A-1.

The Hearing was held at 10:00 AM on Thursday, January 3, 2008, at the Springfield office of the Board of Elections located at 1020 South Spring Street, Springfield IL. Robert Sprague, Chairman, appeared on behalf of the Committee. According to Mr. Sprague's testimony and a review of the 2007 June Semi-Annual report, this Committee made only two contributions to candidates on the 2007 CE ballot, a \$200 contribution to Citizens for Eastern on 3/15/07 and a \$250 contribution to Alvin Parks, Jr. on 4/12/07. Mr. Sprague also testified that no other expenditures were made on behalf of any candidates on the April 17, 2007 ballot.

I recommend that the appeal be granted, as there is no evidence that the activities of this Committee met the definition of participation in regards to the 2007 CE held on April 17, 2007. A review of the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report, along with Mr. Sprague's testimony, indicates that this Committee did not participate in the 2007 Consolidated Election, and therefore, the Committee was not required to file the Schedule A-1 in question.


According to the political committee's December 2006 Semi Annual Report, it received a contribution from Novak Construction, dated February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2007, in the amount of \$4,000.00, during the Schedule A-1 filing period, January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2007 through and including February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007, which failed to be reported as required by statute. The political committee is fined an assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$4,000.00.

Ms. Patricia Ann Roets, Esq., for Mr. Frank A. Avila, Counsel for the IL Committee for Honest Government, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2007, indicating in part: "That the webpage from the State Board of Elections website clearly shows that the Illinois Committee for Honest Government submitted an A-1 form on Sunday, February 25 via electronic transmission & that the only item the ICHG could have included on that A-1 was the \$4,000 from Novak Construction, which was received by the ICHG late in the day on Thursday, February 22; and that the Committee should not be fined civil penalties for a failure to file, if indeed any such alleged failure to file did occur, which alleged failure was caused by a technical malfunction in the Board's own website".

Attached to the Affidavit is a copy of an email originating from Mr. Rupert Borgsmiller, Director/Disclosure Division, to Ms. Patricia Roets indicating that the political "committee did upload a A-1 on 2/25/07, but the form was blank".

Hearing in this matter was set for Monday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007, to be telephonically conducted on/or about 9:00 a.m.

After reviewing the documents in this matter, and discussions with Mr. Avila, it is the opinion of the Hearing Examiner that a technical error in the attachment or cloning of information related to the Novak Construction occurred, which caused the Schedule A-1 to be electronically filed blank. The Hearing Examiner truly believes the Schedule A-1 uploaded on February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2007, was filed with the intent to disclose the Novak Construction contribution, received on February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2007. The Hearing Examiner strongly encourages the political committee in the future to view contents of electronic transmissions to assure completeness. It is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be granted in this matter.







**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing  
the June 2007 Semi-Annual Report

The Final Report, filed in lieu of the 2007 Semi-Annual Report was received on October 19, 2007, 56 days late, resulting in a \$4200 civil penalty. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$450 civil penalty (paid, not appealed) for delinquently filing the 1999 June Semi-Annual Report, a \$100 civil penalty (appeal denied, paid) for delinquently filing a pre-election report for the 2000 General Primary Election, and a \$75 civil penalty (paid, not appealed) for delinquently filing the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$4200.

Mark Riefenberg, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Riefenberg referenced an attached letter. In the letter, Mr. Riefenberg stated that he has been filing electronically, and since July 23, 2002, has had a balance carry over of \$16.99. Since that date he has not participated nor have there been any committee activities to report. He stated that after receiving notice of the 2007 Semi-Annual Report, he contacted staff and after discussing his situation, he decided to close out his cash balance and thought that a filing he made on July 24, 2007, would have been his final report. He states that it appears he incorrectly did not file the proper report, and thus it resulted in the last report being filed October 19, 2007. He intended to file the proper report electronically to close out the committee, since there has been no activity to report over the past five plus years.

I contacted Mr. Riefenberg by phone in order to learn more about the electronic filing issue he raised in his defense. He believed that he had transmitted the report at the time, but admits that he did not receive a receipt. He created the final report using the computer on the first floor; his fax machine is in the basement, and he does not often check it. He speculates that he may have been interrupted during transmission, and when he came back to the computer, merely assumed that the report had successfully uploaded. He is an experienced electronic filer and has been filing electronically for seven years; but no report was filed by Mr. Riefenberg on July 24<sup>th</sup>. However, in order to be consistent with prior Board decisions when an electronic filing issue is used as a defense, I recommend that the appeal be granted. I make this recommendation not only because of the use of an electronic filing issue defense, but also because this Committee has had no activity and has carried a balance of only \$16 since July of 2002 with a debt of more than \$51,000, owed to the candidate, Mr. Riefenberg, and a Final Report has been filed. For the above reasons, I recommend that the appeal be granted.





Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failing to File  
A Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election


This Committee received four contributions of \$1,500 each, on 2/8/07, 2/12/07, 2/15/07, and 2/16/07, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1. The assessed penalty is \$6,000.

Michael D. Zahn, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Zahn stated that they were unaware that the A-1 needed to be filed. While that is not a good excuse, it is the truth. They have tried to file accurate returns as is evident in their amended filings. Their failure to file the A-1 was an honest mistake and without malice. Their intent is to file their returns correctly and on time. They regret this error and will make every endeavor to have no further violations.

The Hearing was held at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, November, 9, 2007, in the Springfield Office of the State Board of Elections. Michael Zahn, the Treasurer of the Committee, and Sherald Dunham, the individual responsible for filing reports, appeared on behalf of the Committee. Mr. Zahn testified that they hired Ms. Dunham in December of 2006; she had 30 years of accounting experience, but limited political experience. They were unaware of the A-1 filing obligation. They have tried to abide by all rules. Testimony basically reflected the Affidavit submitted by the Committee. In response to my question as to whether this Committee contributed to or made contributions on behalf of any candidates in conjunction with the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, other than the two contributions (\$200 to Citizens for Davlin Committee on 1/15/07 and \$500 to Citizens for Jim Zerkle on 1/15/07) listed on the report, the answer was 'No'.

Based upon the Board decision in *Citizens for Dave Sullivan*, the activity of this Committee in the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, did not reach the participation threshold, as neither of the contributions made by this Committee exceeded \$500. If this Committee did participate in the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, it had no obligation to file Schedule A-1 reports. I therefore, recommend that the appeal be granted.





Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment


For Delinquently Filing the June 2007 Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received on September 21, 2007, 37 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$5000. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$50 penalty (not appealed, paid) for delinquently filing the 2006 June Semi-Annual Report and a \$100 penalty (not appealed, paid) for delinquently filing the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$5000.

Leticia Chavez, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Chavez referenced an attached statement. In the statement, the Treasurer stated that in May 2007, Michelle Chavez, the Chairman, was to hire someone to ensure that disclosure reports were filed on a timely basis. In June 2007, Michelle Chavez, the Chairman, was vacationing in Mexico and became very ill and was hospitalized, only returning from Mexico in July. (Medical records enclosed) The Committee's mailing address was the Chairman's home address and notifications from the Board were not noticed by family until late July. The Treasurer, who had not been the one who had previously done the reports, gathered information, called the Board for assistance, completed the report, and incorrectly thought she had uploaded it successfully on July 31<sup>st</sup>. Ms. Michelle Chavez returned home and continued her recuperation. While recuperating and catching up with her correspondence and campaign/committee affairs, in September, she noticed a letter she had received from the Board stating that the report had not been filed. She contacted the Treasurer regarding this notice from the Board. The Treasurer then contacted Tom Cloonan at the Board and he assisted her and helped her to successfully upload the report. The Treasurer states that the Committee will be extra cautious with future electronic uploads and deadlines.

In order to be consistent with previous Board decisions in which an electronic filing issue is presented as a defense, I recommend that the appeal be granted. There do appear to have been some internal problems in regards to these filings which may also have contributed to this delinquency, but the Chairman was in the process of addressing these problems when taken seriously ill in Mexico. However, because the new Treasurer had attempted to file on July 31<sup>st</sup> and believed the report had been filed, and also because the Committee has recently changed its mailing address to that of the Treasurer, rather than the Chairman, demonstrating its intention to avoid further delinquencies, I recommend that this appeal be granted.

Our delay in filing the semi-annual report was due to the following circumstances:

In May 2007, Ms. Michelle Chavez, Chairman of the committee, was to hire someone and see to it that disclosure reports were filed on a timely basis with my assistance. Unfortunately, Ms. Michelle Chavez fell very ill in June of 2007. During a vacation in Mexico, Ms. Chavez was hospitalized. It was found that she had a large tumor next to her kidney and she would have to be operated. Her condition was very serious and her recuperation was long. This prevented her from returning home, and she remained in Mexico until July. We have included some of her medical records for your verification.

During her absence, the mail for the committee continued to be sent to her home address. It wasn't until late July that her family took notice of the letters from the Board of Elections. At that point, which was July 31<sup>st</sup>, I collected the information needed to complete the report and then realized it was going to be about 10 days late because the deadline was changed from the previous years' July 31<sup>st</sup> deadline. This was my first time filing a report electronically on IDIS, however, I called the board of elections for assistance and completed the report. Unfortunately, I made the mistake of failing to verify that the upload was successful, when the transmission had in fact not worked. At that point, we were under the assumption that the report was sent.

Ms. Michelle Chavez returned home and continued her recuperation, although struggling with many health concerns. It took her some time to catch up with all her correspondence and her campaign/committee affairs. In September she called me to notify me of a notice she received. She was very upset and stated the notice said the report was not filed. I called and spoke to Mr. Tom Cloonan at the State Board of Elections. Mr. Cloonan had assisted the committee in the past when we had questions regarding disclosure. He explained to me that the report had not been received and then instructed me on how to file it and make sure it uploaded successfully this time. We even discussed future reports to make sure I understood exactly how and when to file so we wouldn't have the same situation in the future.

It was never the intention of the committee to delay the report. It was an oversight on my part. It is important to reiterate that we were under the impression the report was filed on July 31. We completed the report on IDIS but didn't realize the upload failed. Ms. Michelle Chavez's health concerns only added to our delay.

It is for this reason that we respectfully ask for reconsideration and appeal the fine assessed. The fine assessed would be very detrimental to our committee. We assure you that going forward, we will be extra cautious with electronic uploads and deadlines.



**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment  
Delinquently Filing the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received on October 12, 2007, 52 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$1300.

Robert Eastern, Jr., the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and an Appeal Affidavit.

On the Affidavit, Mr. Eastern stated that the Committee did not receive the mailings regarding the report. Mail is sometimes not received because of being left at the wrong address.

The Hearing was held on Thursday, December 13, 2007, in the Springfield Office of the Board of Elections at 1020 So Spring St., Springfield IL, 62704. Robert Eastern, Jr., the Chairman of the Committee appeared on behalf of the Committee. At the hearing he stated that the Committee did not receive the notifications for the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report, and that the Committee sometimes does not get its mail. They believe that it is delivered to 1208 State St., rather than 1210 State St., the Committee's address. Mr. Eastern stated that the Committee has received mail for the business at 1208 State St.; when that happens, Mr. Eastern delivers the mail. Apparently the inhabitants of the business located at 1208 do not extend the same courtesy to Mr. Eastern. They have tried using a post office box, but have a similar problem with that. Mr. Eastern pointed out that this Committee has an exemplary filing history and would not have carelessly failed to file if it had received notification.

Although this is a problem apparently beyond Mr. Eastern's control, I must recommend that the appeal be denied. The address to which notifications are mailed is a good address, and one which the Committee wishes to continue using. Our records indicate that the packet was mailed to this address on 5/30/07, and a reminder notice sent 7/10/07; therefore, the Board has met its statutory obligations. Our records also indicate that this Committee has been inactive since the first half of 2005, and Mr. Eastern said that it will remain inactive until 2009; it is more easily understood that deadlines may be missed when the Committee has had no activity, but that does not eliminate a Committee's obligation to file. I don't doubt that Mr. Eastern is committed to ensuring that this Committee file its reports timely; the filing history reflects that, but if a problem exists with the mail delivery, he needs to avail himself of other means to ensure that he does not miss important filing deadlines. He is now in possession of the 2008 Campaign Disclosure calendar that will advise him of filing deadlines, even if mail delivery remains unreliable. Notifications by e-mail are also an option; this option would eliminate the mail delivery problem. In order to receive notifications by e-mail, he should contact Board staff. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed.

This Committee received 4 contributions: (1) 1 of \$2500 received on 3/29/07 and listed on a Schedule A-1 filed delinquently on 4/13/07; (2) 1 of \$1500 received on 4/9/07 and listed on a Schedule A-1 filed delinquently on 4/13/07; (3) 1 of \$1000 received on 4/9/07 and listed on a Schedule A-1 filed delinquently on 4/13/07; and (4) 1 of \$2500 received on 4/9/07 and listed on a Schedule A-1 filed delinquently on 7/16/07. The total assessment is \$7500.

Sandra Wagner, the Chairman and Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

All remaining monies have been donated to the college foundation. She asks that the penalty be waived and stresses that there was no devious or malicious intent, merely a mistake which was corrected promptly.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. But since this is the first election for which any Schedule A1 was delinquently filed, and since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment or \$750.00 In addition, since this Committee has filed a Final Report, I further recommend that should the Committee remain dissolved for a period of 2 years following the date of the Final Order imposing the penalty, the fine be abated.





Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failure to File Schedule A-1's  
in conjunction with the February 2007 Consolidated Primary Election

According to the political committee's June 2007 Semi Annual Report, it received four (4) contributions, in relation to the February 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, during the Schedule A-1 filing period, January 29<sup>th</sup>, 2007 through and including February 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007, which failed to be reported as required by statute. The political committee is fined an assessed civil penalty in the amount of \$13,100.00.

Ms. Kristin Donels, Treasurer, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on November 20<sup>th</sup>, 2007, indicating in part: "Penalties were wrongly assessed for the applicable reporting schedule for the reasons that will be presented at the hearing".

Hearing in this matter was set for Monday, December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:00 a.m.

Ms. Kristin Donels, Treasurer, and Mr. Michael Kasper, Counsel, appeared on behalf of the political committee. Mr. Kasper indicated the political committee filed a significant number of Schedule A-1's for the 2007 February Consolidated Primary in a timely manner. Mr. Kasper acknowledged the political committee unintentionally failed to file required Schedule A-1's as indicated in the Board's assessment.

After reviewing the documents in this matter, and discussions with the Respondent(s), the Hearing Examiner finds there are no reasonable grounds for the failure of the political committee to file the required Schedule A-1's. Therefore it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied. Since this is the first delinquent filing of Schedule A-1's by the political committee, it is recommended that the assessed civil penalty be reduced to 10% of the total amount or \$1,310.00, and be due and owing.





**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing  
the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report.


The Report was received on September 4, 2007, 24 days late, resulting in a civil penalty assessment of \$1200. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$625 civil penalty (not appealed) for delinquently filing the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$1825.

Amy Powers, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Ms. Powers stated that this Committee was no longer active and they were working on disbursing the remaining funds and closing the Committee. They regret that these last two semi-annual reports were delinquently filed; at the time Mr. Lewis was dealing with the illness and passing of his mother. Mrs. Briscoe, the candidate's mother, was the chairman/co-chairman of the Committee at the time of her death.

The Hearing was scheduled for 11:30 on Tuesday, December 18, 2007, at the office of the Board of Elections at 1020 South Spring Street, Springfield, IL. Mr. Randy Lewis, the candidate, appeared on behalf of the Committee. He stated that Delores Briscoe, his late mother, and Amy Powers did the reports together and kept the books together. His mother became ill and subsequently passed away in February 2007. Mr. Lewis had run for county board on the 2006 GE ballot and lost. He also ran for park district in 2007, but had not raised any funds since his county board race in the fall of 2006. While dealing with his mother's illness, the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report was delinquently filed; however, this assessment was not appealed. In regards to the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report, Mr. Lewis and Ms. Powers thought that they were finished and no longer needed to file reports. When their error was realized, Ms. Powers filed the delinquent report on September 4, 2007. She has since filed a Final Report on December 14, 2007. Mr. Lewis does not plan to seek office again.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. It is clear that this has been a difficult time for Mr. Lewis; however, notifications were received by Mr. Lewis for the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report, and because he and his treasurer, Ms. Powers assumed nothing further needed to be filed, the Committee's filing obligations were not met. A call to the Board would have clarified the matter for the parties. The total assessment is \$1825. However, since this Committee has filed a Final Report, I further recommend that should the Committee remain dissolved for a period of two years following the date of the Final Order imposing the penalty, the fine be abated.




Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing the  
June 2007 Semi-Annual Report

The political committee's June 2007 Semi-Annual Report was received by the State Board of Elections (herein referred to as SBE) on October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2007, fifty-two (52) days late. As such, the political committee has been assessed a fine of \$1,300.00. In addition, the political committee was previously assessed a penalty of \$1,000.00 for the delinquent filing of its Pre-Election Report for the 2007 Consolidated Election. The total assessment is \$2,300.00. Since this is a subsequent violation, it will be required to be paid by the political committee within thirty (30) days of the issuance of a Final Board Order.

Mr. Jamal Barnes, Candidate/Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007, indicating in part, "the committee didn't raise the required \$3,000; the committee will file a final report; and the chairman experienced dire personal matters".

Hearing in this matter was set for Tuesday, December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:00 a.m.

I feel based upon a review of the documents presented in this matter, consideration of a prior filing delinquency (\$1,000.00), and the filing of a Final Report on Wednesday, December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2007, it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that (1) the appeal be denied, and (2) the assessed civil penalty of \$2,300.00 be abated if the political committee remains dissolved for a period of two years following the date of the Final Order of the Board imposing the penalty. Mr. Barnes acknowledged and indicated an understanding of the conditions of the recommended abatement at the time the Final Report was filed.




This Committee filed a Statement of Nonparticipation for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election on 1/29/07. It had made a \$750 contribution to Richard M. Daley on 1/24/07, triggering participation status. For failure to file a pre-election report, the civil penalty assessment is \$500. On 1/29/07, the Committee received 1 contribution of \$1500, but failed to list it on a Schedule A-1. The assessed penalty is \$1500. The total assessment is \$2250.

David Chapman, the Treasurer of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and an Appeal Affidavit.

The Hearing was scheduled for 10:00 AM on Tuesday, December 18, 2007, at the Springfield Office of the Board of Elections at 1020 South Spring Street, Springfield IL. David Chapman, the Committee Treasurer, appeared on behalf of the Committee.

Mr. Chapman acknowledged that the Committee made a \$750 contribution to Richard M. Daley, which was verified by reports filed by the Richard M. Daley Campaign Committee. Mr. Chapman sought clarification on several points regarding the filing of a pre-election report vs. a statement of nonparticipation, as well as other filing issues.

I recommend the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. However, since there is no indication that the Schedule A-1 violation was anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, and since this is the first such Schedule A-1 violation, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$150. This \$150 penalty plus the \$500 penalty for failure to file the pre-election report total \$650. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, this amount will be due and owing.







The transfer was recorded on the Semi-Annual Report as a contribution. They have since implemented an additional control procedure which will help to prevent any reoccurrence of this problem.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. However, since there is no indication that this violation was anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, and since this is this Committee's first Schedule A-1 violation, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$5,000. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed.



**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**

Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Failing to File  
A Schedule A-1 for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election

This Committee received 13 contributions on 2/7/07, but failed to list them on a Schedule A-1. The total assessed penalty is \$24,865.69.

Jim Bruner, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Bruner stated that an unanticipated cash flow disruption in early 2007 changed the timing of receipts and deposits into the committee's account, causing the Committee to inadvertently fall within the primary election reporting window.

The Hearing was scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, December 19, 2007, at the Springfield office of the State Board of Elections at 1020 South Spring Street, Springfield IL. Appearing on behalf of the Committee were Bruce Stratton, Attorney, Justin Reichert, Attorney, and Robin Ellison, secretary. Mr. Stratton stated that normally the check from IAP Association, Illinois Asphalt Pavement Association, is written in early January to avoid the situation they currently find themselves in. Because of recent economic problems, members aren't sending checks as timely; therefore, this check was received by the GGC in early February rather than early January. The one check from the IAP Association included the 13 contributions for which the committee is being assessed penalties; this breakdown is provided the GGC at the time it receives the check. Their intent is to always receive this check in early January to avoid the need for the filing of an A-1. In 2007, the check was received in early February. They are not disputing when the check was received. There was no intent on the part of the Committee; it was a matter of collective forgetfulness on the part of Committee members, and the fact that these funds are normally received earlier in the year.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. However, since there is no indication that these violations were anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, and since this is the first violation of the type for this Committee, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$2,487. If this recommendation is accepted by the Board, the \$2,487 civil penalty will be due and owing.


This Committee received one contribution of \$15,000 on 4/5/07, but failed to list it on a Schedule A-1. The assessed penalty is \$15,000.

Michael D. Zahn, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Zahn stated that they were unaware that the A-1 needed to be filed. While that is not a good excuse, it is the truth. They have tried to file accurate returns as is evident in their amended filings. Their failure to file the A-1 was an honest mistake and without malice. Their intent is to file their returns correctly and on time. They regret this error and will make every endeavor to have no further violations.

The Hearing was held at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, November, 9, 2007, in the Springfield Office of the State Board of Elections. Michael Zahn, the Chairman of the Committee, and Sherald Dunham, the individual responsible for filing reports, appeared on behalf of the Committee. Mr. Zahn testified that they hired Ms. Dunham in December of 2006; she had 30 years of accounting experience, but limited political experience. They were unaware of the A-1 filing obligation. They have tried to abide by all rules. Testimony basically reflected the Affidavit submitted by the Committee.

I recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. However, since there is no indication that this violation was anything other than inadvertent and unintentional, and since this is the Committee's first Schedule A-1 violation, I also recommend that the penalty be reduced to 10% of the original assessment, or \$1,500. As a first violation, the penalty is stayed.






The political committee's June 2007 Semi-Annual Report was received by the State Board of Elections (herein referred to as SBE) on September 14<sup>th</sup>, 2007, thirty-two (32) days late. As such, the political committee has been assessed a fine of \$3,200.00. In addition, the political committee was previously assessed a penalty of \$500.00 for the delinquent filing of the June 30<sup>th</sup> 2006 Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$3,700.00.

Mr. Homero Tristan, Chairman, filed a Request for Hearing and Appeal Affidavit, on November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007, indicating in part: "(1) We immediately contacted the committee's accountant to assist us in gathering financial information, preparing and filing these reports; (2) We attempted to file the reports electronically, however we were unable to obtain electronic access. As a result, we could not initially file the reports; (3) the committee does not have much, if any, amounts of activity to report, and, (4) the committee did not ignore the reporting requirements set forth by the State Board of Elections. The committee has respected and upheld the spirit and the intent of the reporting requirements and regulations of the State of Illinois".

Hearing in this matter was set for Tuesday, December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2007, to be conducted at the Chicago Board office, 100 W. Randolph, 14-100, at 9:30 a.m.

Mr. Homero Tristan, Chairman, appeared on behalf of the political committee. Mr. Tristan indicated that a change in personnel responsible for the electronic filing and uploading of reports occurred which caused confusion. Mr. Tristan stated such individual was not an officer of the political committee as identified on the Statement of Organization, Form D-1. The Hearing Examiner notes the "treasurer of a political committee shall be responsible for keeping the records and filing the statements and reports required by this section", 10 ILCS 5/9-2 et. seq.

I feel based upon a review of the statements/documents presented in this matter, and consideration of a prior filing delinquency (\$500.00), it is the recommendation of the Hearing Examiner that the appeal be denied, and the total assessed fine of \$3,700.00 is due and owing.

In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$525 civil penalty (not appealed) for delinquently filing the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$1925.


David Sherrill, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Request for Hearing and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Sherrill stated that the treasurer quit and they were not aware of the late filings. The last and final filing was sent but for some reason did not go through. Also, they were unaware that they had to do the final close out filing.

The Hearing was held on Thursday, December 13, 2007, at 10:30 A.M. in the Springfield office of the State Board of Elections, 1020 South Spring Street, Springfield, IL. David Sherrill, the Chairman and Candidate, appeared on behalf of the Committee. Mr. Sherrill stated that he ran for State Senate in 2004 and was defeated. His treasurer, Glenn O'Bryan kept the Committee open. When the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report was delinquent, Mr. Sherrill contacted Mr. O'Bryan who stated that he was too busy to continue as treasurer, but would do this one final report. He did not follow up and file the report. Mr. Sherrill asked his assistant, Missy Schipkowski, to file his reports for him. She filed the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report, a Statement of Nonparticipation for the 2007 Consolidated Primary Election, and a pre-election report for the 2007 Consolidated Election. There was confusion in regards to any reports after that. There was intent to final the Committee, but remaining funds needed to be disposed of. At some point, Ms. Schipkowski told Mr. Sherrill that she thought she had filed the 2007 June Semi-Annual Report prior to the filing deadline. When it was finally filed, she followed that up with a Final Report. Because any references to electronic filing issues were vague, I suggested that it might be helpful if Ms. Schipkowski were to submit an affidavit with some detail regarding her efforts to file the report electronically prior to the filing deadline. As of this date, I have received nothing from either Ms. Schipkowski or Mr. Sherrill and must assume that Ms.

Schipkowski could provide no further information than what she had included on the Appeal Affidavit, and what was provided by Mr. Sherrill at the appeal hearing.

I therefore recommend that the appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. Although electronic filing issues were mentioned in the defense, because of the failure to provide any details, and because of other issues which may have impacted this delinquent filing, such as the resignation of the treasurer, and the lack of activity in the Committee, I recommend that the appeal be denied. However, since this Committee filed a Final Report on 9/12/07, I further recommend that should the Committee remain dissolved for a period of two years following the date of the Final Order imposing the penalty, that the fine of \$1925 be abated.





**REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Appeal of Civil Penalty Assessment for Delinquently Filing the  
2007 June Semi-Annual Report

The Report was received October 15, 2007, 52 days late, resulting in a penalty assessment of \$2600. In addition, the Committee had previously been assessed a \$125 civil penalty (not appealed) for delinquently filing the 2006 June Semi-Annual Report. The total assessment is \$2725.

Jason A. Barickman, the Chairman of the Committee, filed a Waiver of Appearance and submitted on the Appeal Affidavit the following:

On the Affidavit, Mr. Barickman stated that they thought this Committee had been closed. Their office moved and when they finally received the mail from their old office, they were severely delinquent. They had made a timely effort to get this resolved, and any penalty/fine is going to be a tremendous detriment to the Committee.

The last report this Committee had filed prior to the report in question was the 2006 December Semi-Annual Report, filed 1/31/07, and that report showed an ending balance of \$416. Along with the delinquent 2007 June Semi-Annual Report, the Committee also filed an amended 2006 December Semi-Annual Report (new closing balance of \$188 on 12/31/06), and a Final Report, all on 10/15/07. Section 5/9-5 of the Campaign Financing Act states that any political committee "...which...dissolves as a political committee or determines that it will no longer receive any campaign contributions nor make any campaign expenditures shall notify the Board...and file with the Board...a final report with respect to its contributions and expenditures, including the final disposition of its funds and assets." The Board received no notification and no Final Report was filed prior to the reports filed on 10/15/07. The Board also received no notification of an address change for the Committee. Therefore, I recommend the Appeal be denied for lack of an adequate defense. If this recommendation is accepted, the stay will be lifted from the previous assessment, and the total assessment will be \$2725. However, since this Committee has filed a Final Report, I further recommend that should the Committee remain dissolved for a period of 2 years following the date of the Final Order imposing the penalty, the fine be abated.







**Procedural History**

On May 18, 2007, the above referenced Complainant filed a Form D-4, Complaint for violation of the Campaign Disclosure Act, wherein it is specifically alleged that pursuant to 10 ILCS 5/9-13, and 5/9-14, the Respondent failed to file a Semi Annual Report for the period specified above.

On June 21, 2007, a Closed Preliminary Hearing was convened at the Chicago Offices of the State Board of Elections. At that time, Respondent failed to appear at said hearing, nor had the report in question been filed, and as a result, the Hearing Examiner recommended that a Public Hearing be conducted. On July 3, 2007, the Board issued an Order that a Public Hearing be held.


On July 25, 2007, 10:00 AM, after noting that Proof of Service upon the Respondent had been obtained, a Public Hearing was convened. Tony Morgando, Deputy Director of Campaign Disclosure, as well as Tara Cachur, Campaign Disclosure Specialist appeared on behalf of the Complainant. No appearance was entered on behalf of the Respondent. At hearing, Ms. Cachur tendered the following documents, a D-1, Statement of Organization (Exhibit 1), a Semi Annual Report for the period ending 6/30/06 (Exhibit 2), and a Schedule A-1 with 3 contributions totaling \$13,000. Complainant requested of this hearing examiner that a subpoena be issued to the Respondent's bank for the purpose of obtaining records related to Respondent Committee's financial activity. Complainant noted items that required further examination. Said request was granted. This matter was continued until August 15<sup>th</sup>. On this date, Respondent once again failed to appear.

After substantial communication and meetings with Ms. Cachur and the Respondent Rowe, the latter, Mr. Rowe, on November 20, 2007, filed additional and/or amended A-1 Reports, a Semi-Annual Report for the period at issue, and a Final Report.


On December 20, 2007, a hearing was held. In attendance on behalf of the Complainant were Deputy Director Tony Morgando, and Disclosure Specialist Cachur. Mr. Rowe attended on behalf of the Respondent. At that time, Ms. Cachur indicated that Mr. Rowe had filed the December 2006 Semi Annual Report. She furthermore indicated that after a review of the reports, the Division was satisfied with the information contained therein. They noted that a Final Report was also on filed. **REPORT OF HEARING EXAMINER**  
Report of Public Hearing for the Failure to File the  
December 2006 Semi Annual Report and  
the Pre Election Report for the  
April 2007 Consolidated Primary

**Procedural History**

On June 28, 2007 the Complainant filed a Form D-4 Complaint for violation of the Campaign Disclosure Act, wherein it specifically alleges that pursuant to sections 10 ILCS 5/9-10, 5/9-11, 5/9-12, 5/9-13, 5/9-14, of the Campaign Disclosure Act, the Respondent failed to file a December 2006 Semi Annual Report as well as a April 2007 Pre Election Report.

On July 17, 2007, a Closed Preliminary Hearing was convened in the Chicago office of the State Board of Elections. Complainant presented its case and stood upon the allegations as set forth in the Form D-4 complaint. There was no appearance entered on behalf of the Respondent. As a result of the above, the Hearing Examiner recommended that complaint was filed on justifiable grounds, and that a public hearing be held.

On August 22, 2007, after consideration of the evidence, the Board issued an order for a Public Hearing to be held regarding the alleged violations.

On September 25, 2007, after receipt of proof of service upon the Respondent, a Public Hearing was convened in the Chicago office of the State Board of Elections. Tony Morgando, Deputy Director of Campaign Disclosure appeared on behalf of the Complainant. Attorney Michael Durkin, as well as the Respondent Committee's chairperson, Mary Ann Desecki appeared on behalf of the Respondent.

## Hearing Proceedings

Mr. Morgando testified that prior to the commencement of hearing; he had the opportunity to speak to the attorney for the Respondent. The attorney indicated that he was prepared to file the Semi Annual for the period at issue. A report dated 9/25/07 (date of hearing) was in fact filed. He furthermore indicated that more time was needed to prepare the Pre Election report at issue. Mr. Morgando requested that we grant the Respondent 30 days to file said report. Mr. Durkin stipulated to the fact that the reports were not filed timely. He furthermore asserted that while the Semi Annual Report had been filed that morning, Respondent needed additional time to file the Pre Election Report. A period of 30 days was granted to file the Pre Election Report.

## Conclusions and Recommendations

This Complaint was filed on justifiable grounds. The Respondent acknowledged that both reports had not been timely filed. However, the Respondent filed its December 2006 Semi Annual report on the day of the hearing, and sought an extension of time to file an accurate Pre Election report. On October 22, 2007, the Respondent filed its April 2007 Pre Election report and its June 2007 Semi-annual report. As a result, the Respondent has come into compliance by addressing the issues complained of. On October 25, 2007, the Board assessed civil penalties for the delinquent filings and a Final Order was issued on December 7, 2007. The committee also filed a Final report on December 12, 2007 and turned its remaining funds over to the State Board as partial payment of fines due. In light of the filings of the reports at issue, the subsequent assessments for their delinquent filing and the partial payment of the assessments by the committee, I recommend that no further action be taken. Furthermore, if the committee remains dissolved for a period of two years following the effective date of the Final Order without forming a Successor Committee the remaining unpaid fine amount will be abated.


